Club Points

Are you competing with your dog? Well I guess most of us are, judging by the numbers who have entered the Winter League and the Andover matches.

You get a clear round with your dog and want to tell everyone about it? I know I do!

As a Club we have a Results page (was 'Boasts') on our own Wiki – this is different to facebook in that it is only open to Club members. As a part of the Wiki we also have a spreadsheet where everyone can have their successes recorded. Basically a clear round is worth 1 point (more points if you gain a place!) – and you would be surprised how these mount up over the year. At our AGM we have trophies and certificates for the dog/handler who have gained the most points between 1st January to 31st December each year. New dogs start in Starters – if you move up the grades you will then be entered into Novice and finally Senior. There is also a section for our younger members – Juniors.

What do you need to know/record

The date and name of show; place gained (or clear round); how many dogs were in your class. If you do not have access to the Wiki and would still like to record your results then please email me with this information and I will make sure it gets entered onto the results page and then onto the spreadsheet.

Which shows count?

Basically any competitive show – I have already entered the January Winter League results and will do the same for February and the Andover Match – then it is up to you. Let me know if you need help. UKA/Nedlo/Kelluki/KC to name just a few that you may have already participated in – they all count.

The spreadsheet on the Wiki gets quite big as the weeks go by, so I will try and update (say) the top 3 places in each section via Watchdog – just to keep your appetites whetted! Lol!

Kennel Club updates



The Kennel Club General Committee agreed that, with over 2,500 licensed events taking place each year, the Kennel Club no longer has the facility to retain either hard or electronic copies for every event. Therefore, with effect from 1st January 2015, the regulations will be amended to reflect the following changes:

For the disciplines of agility, bloodhound trials, heelwork to music, obedience, working trials and rally, societies and clubs will no longer be required to submit any schedules to the Kennel Club. Organisers will still need to retain their schedules for at least one year.

2015 Agility Regulation Changes

The following amendments to the agility 'H' regulations were approved by the General Committee and came into effect on 1 January 2015.

Regulation H(1)10.e. (Competing)

TO: Food shall not Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand or while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring - elimination. (Deletions struck through. Amendments in bold)

Regulation H(1)(A)4.

TO: Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. Agility classes to include contact obstacles and Jumping classes when there are no contact obstacles. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: 'A Ramp', Dog Walk and See-Saw. In the event of mitigating circumstances (i.e. adverse weather conditions) at a show a Judge, with the full agreement of the Competition Manager, may omit an item of compulsory equipment as deemed appropriate at the time. Any omission from the equipment must be reported by the show management to the Kennel Club within 14 days of the date of the show. With this proviso classes are defined as follows: (Deletions struck through. Amendments in bold)

Insertion of new Regulation H(1)(B)5a.(22)(Marking)

INSERT: Handler traverses over, under or through any piece of equipment - elimination. (Insertion in bold)

Regulation H(1)(D)9.e. - for Limited Shows

TO: Silent toys may be used in the rings, at the discretion of the organisers, but must be used with consideration for other competitors. Food may not be given to dogs or carried in the ring in any classes. Except for mobility aids or silent toys, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring elimination. (Deletions struck through. Amendments in bold)

Wallingford Show - 18th/19th April

Just a reminder that we have our own show coming up in April. This show is run by us as a Club and relies on everyone coming, participating and/or helping.

Have you/should you enter?

There are paper entry forms available on Thursday evenings if you are unable to enter on-line. If you are unsure about what to enter or how to enter trainers are willing to help. Remember that if your dog is not yet jumping their full height, there is an Anysize class which is just jumps and tunnels over lower height jumps.

If your dog can jump full height jumps, but not weave yet, there is a Steeplechase class which is just jumps and tunnels. Prior to competing, however, you will need to have registered your dog with the Kennel Club and you will also need to get your dog measured. (Ask any of the committee/trainers or those who have competed at a KC show before if you are unsure what to do or how to do it.)

How does the show work?

On Thursday 16th April, lunchtime, we get access to Newbury Showground. We set up our own caravans and then start on the job of preparing for everyone to arrive. The biggest job, by far, on Thursday and Friday is marking out all the camping spaces, ready for competitors to start arriving on the Friday. If you are able to come Thursday afternoon we will be forming lines of members with spray cans creating 'L' shapes on the ground – the more the merrier. We will provide tea, coffee and cakes.

Based on how many trainers are staying at Newbury Showground in their caravans we will make a decision regarding training that Thursday (someone remind us nearer the date to make a decision!).

Friday 17th **April** – as early as possible – we will continue to mark out camping spaces. We also need to mark out space for trade stands and of course the ring spaces. Our hired competition

agility equipment will arrive so help is needed unloading the lorries, putting the jumps together, etc., ready for each ring.

We need to erect tents for scoring on each ring, and get tables and chairs to the right places. Some people will be already be working in the marquee getting boxes of supplies and paperwork sorted out for the rings the following day. Lunch and of course teas and coffees will be available throughout the day for club members and we usually get a takeaway in the evening for those who have worked all day on the Friday.



On Friday afternoon we need a rota of helpers to start manning the entrance gate and directing people to their camping spaces. It is quite good to do this in pairs – a great way to get to know people. At various times on the Friday things will arrive like waste skips, mobile

toilets, etc. By 4pm Friday the area should be looking something like an agility show with a stream of people arriving to set up their camping spaces.

Saturday/Sunday – show days. We will be allocating everyone who can come, a job – most probably on a ring. Of course, if you are running a dog, you will be given plenty of time to walk courses and run your dogs. If you don't know how to do something, there is a ring manager allocated to each ring and they can help you out with how to undertake your allocated job. The show cannot run efficiently without your help – so thank you in advance. Show days realistically start at 7 or 7.30am for us and finish after all the rings have stopped running. We provide refreshments and lunch for everyone on these days.

Scorer and Scrimer – both jobs that need a bit more experience, but you could take

the opportunity to do it alongside someone who has done it before.



The Ring Manager will talk you through any job if you are unsure. And if you have a member of the family who wants to come and help – then they too can participate and we will be grateful for all extra pairs of hands.

Nearer the time we will be making a list of who is available to help on each day. You will not be expected to work without breaks — an hour on an hour off is quite a fun way to work. If you come along to help you may also want to bring some money, as there will be several trade stands selling all sorts of things including dog toys, dog beds, leads and harnesses, running shoes, etc.

I have detailed how the days work, to give those of you who have not been to a show before an overview of the different jobs associated with running an event like this. Some of you have joined us at Winter League and Andover matches – our show in April is just a much larger version of these (IoI!).

If you want clarity on anything – please ask.
