For our annual Christmas party, everyone comes for the whole evening, arriving 7.30pm to set up and finishing around10pm

We split into teams with a mix of all levels of handlers and dogs, and enjoy two fun runs or games. Each team takes their turn to play the agility games, ring party, and eat food! Christmassy themed dog/human accessories welcome!





For this evening if you usually train more than one dog we need you to pick one who would like to compete/play. There

will be a signup sheet at club a few weeks before and you can put your name down. If you would like to bring some food to contribute to the feast there will also be a signup list for that too.

At the end of the evening there are prizes! We also have a giant Christmas card which everyone can sign to/from everyone and put some money in the club's charity pot, instead of giving out individual cards.

2016 Training New Groups/Times

When club restarts training on 7th January 2016 the groups will have been moved around.

Each year in January the classes rotate to give everyone a fair turn at putting out the equipment and packing away. The way this is done is that the first class moves to the end of the evening, the last class moves to the middle, and the middle class moves to the start of the evening.

It is also a good chance to make any changes needed to even up the groups, or to fill in gaps where people have sadly left us. There will be a few new dogs starting in the new year – please make them feel welcome.

If you have not done setting up or packing away before and do not know how to put together or take apart a piece of equipment, please just ask your trainer!

Winter League Match One – October 17th

So we came last in our first attempt at the Winter League 2015/16 however we were not far behind and we had fun! With the help of Claire Jones and Jill Lowe, and with the backing of the committee, this year we are treating it more like winter training and aim to include many club members in classes they are ready for. It was also agreed by committee that we would give priority to those that train regularly at club.

The new league rules mean that eliminations can no longer gain points and the scoring has changed so small /mediums are still running against each other but no longer against larges. This means the top two small/mediums and also the top three large dogs from each club will score points provided they are not eliminated.

The new rules state that if you have competed at a UKA or KC show, even NFC or in nursery, you are not eligible for the Nursery class. Also, those who have competed in Nursery at Winter League are not eligible the following year. The Nursery class is purely for new handlers and dogs to give them competition experience. However you can compete in nursery for all 4 matches in one year. You can also still do Anysize with Nursery, plus of course you can use the practice ring in the afternoon.

It was a great day, no-one missed walking their course, Gill Kimber set some lovely courses and WDTC ring party were great as usual with newer club members learn ring party skills. There were some great runs, lots of cheering, lots of 'if only' moments, and a few triumphantly awesome ones too! Fortunately my threat to delete anyone from future dates if they were late worked well, as no one turned up late, ha ha! Lots of happy faces and waggy tails!

I think it is important to take into account that Wallingford is a large club and we have a variety of dogs and handlers competing at different levels. We differ from clubs such as Thames as we have a lot more inexperienced handlers taking part in the Winter League so we have tried to split our 100 runs fairly and equally across all the0 classes where possible. For example, some of the other clubs have no Grade 1's, or have higher grade handlers running in four classes each but we have chosen not to do so. 100 runs to our club is actually very limiting as there are so many of us.

Looking at the results it was great to see that a lot of members gained points for the club but probably didn't realise. When I asked Gio-Gio why she likes running Tatti in the Winter League she answered "it gives me a chance to run against adults but unlike

at a show if you don't get placed, it's not pointless as you might get points for your club."

Big thanks to Gill Rhodes for filming as much as possible, we must make sure we also film Gill's runs next time. I don't know about you but whenever I watch my runs back I am kind of hoping I won't mess up but usually do!!! Pat on the back to whoever decided to keep ring party refreshments on a small table so we could continue to provide teas for our members in the afternoon. It also acted as a nice base for members to gather.

We are currently working on the November entries, obviously it varies so much according to availability, there may be occasions when we have to limit to 2 runs or people will be asked to do last minute extra runs. We are aiming to keep this as fair as possible and also adhere to your preferences but sometimes we may have to move you where needed.

We will keep a tally on points but will not be giving awards this year as some have more runs than others and it is a team effort not an individual one after all. So far the support and encouragement for each other has been fantastic. Bring on the next few dates...
