As the agility season comes to a close Alison has asked me to reflect on the achievements of our Juniors this season. And what a successful season!

The Juniors agility year kicked off in late February with OJAC. We entered three U12 teams and came away with podium places for agility and jumping. Our Overs did really well too and were robbed of a place as they ran out of order due to missing keys. However, the great success of the weekend was Gio-Gio winning the agility and the Overall competition and securing herself a place in Team GB for the European champs just a few weeks ago. (I don't want to steal anyone's thunder so watch out for another article on that event alone!).

Just one week later - Rory and Ammo were heading out into the ring at Crufts. A lovely round saw Rory win the U12 Large semi-final and head into the main ring (right). Nerves ran high and an unfortunate bit of overhandling led to an elimination in the final. But what an experience – supported by all his friends at home via You-Tube and Gio-Gio sneaking into the Green Room.

Jenny Kimber (yes she is still a Junior for that event only by virtue of being under 24). Jenny, Rory and Gio-Gio were joined by Jack and Gemma Biddle from Kidderminster, and got the job done well and early – 4 clears and one E, booked their place at Crufts 2014.

So Shade, Ammo, Pip, Bambi and Jose's Poppy need to be booked in with Pam for grooming before Crufts. Go the Juniors and thank you for saving me the stress of the Junior Team ring at other shows during the year – our early win meant we weren't allowed to enter any more YKC Team Events.

The Juniors had a busy KC Festival. Gio-Gio had some lovely runs and came 3rd overall in the International Young Handler, having come 3rd in both jumping and agility heats. Gio-Gio may also have

qualified for Crufts – such is the complexity of the qualification system it depends on which dog another child chooses to take before we know whether Gio-Gio takes a slot. Additionally Gio-Gio has collected an impressive number of points in the ABC event - that should allocate her a place in that event. We wait patiently for those letters in December for confirmation.

The Juniors had a great time at Dogs In Need. Rory + Ammo and Gio-Gio + Bambi + Tatti had a successful few rounds in the Junior Classic – qualifying them for the final. An unfortunate E on the next to last jump saw Gio-Gio out of the running with Bambi and another E with Tatti. However Rory and that old professional Ammo stormed to a lucky clear (ooh that dog walk was hit by a toe nail) and won the DINAS Junior Classic.

The season drew towards its close at Chippenham with Crufts qualifiers. Rory booked his places at Crufts in the Jumping with Ammo, and the agility with Mint with two 2nd places. There is one more Junior event to come which unfortunately clashes with our Andover Match – the Agility for Juniors Grand Prix. This year, for the first time, the event includes adult/Junior pairs – so a lot of pressure on the grown-ups given the success of our kids!

The Juniors would like to thank everyone from whom they have begged, borrowed or stolen a dog in 2013.

Puppy Training with Dave Munnings

On a slightly soggy Friday morning in September I set off with Herbie to drive all of 10 minutes from my house to Dave Munnings' training venue just north of Newbury. There were five puppies on the workshop, ranging in age from 4 months to 9 months – all collies. The youngest was just a ball of fluff and so cute everyone wanted to take her home. The oldest was Taz, half brother to Jo's Sonic, and owned by her brother James – it is a small world!

By strange coincidence, Dave had trained Herbie's much hairier brother Ernie earlier in the week, down in Somerset. I meant to ask at the end of the lesson if he found them similar in character, but I forgot.

Dave started with a discussion on play, and got each of us in turn to bring our pups out and play with them. They all played, which was a great start! We were told to work on three things with toys – grabbing a toy, running to a dead toy, and tugging. It became clear later on that most of us also needed to work on retrieve, as several pups started to play "keep away" with their toys, or just laid down to shred!



For each exercise that we did, Dave would talk through why we did it, and suggest ways to progress it on from the point we were at. We swapped pups and did some collar grabs. This is a real life skill – is your puppy happy for other people to handle him, and even grab him in an emergency?

A lot of the time was spent on recalls e.g. restrained recalls where the handler is moving away with a toy, racing to a dead toy, recalls rewarded with food, etc – as far as the pups were concerned this was all just a game, but for the handlers we had to remember who was supposed to win the toy (you or the pup), where are you running, what do you say, when to feed, and oh dear my brain hurts.

As this was about agility foundations it was important to get the pups running to the "reinforcement zones" either side of you to play, not flanking round wide or cutting in front of you. They all did pretty well, but one of the pups had a truly stunning recall, only 4 months old and her owner could call her off sausages first time! Wow!

Dave talked us through flatwork, tricks, teaching left and right, hand touches, targeting, etc. We did some shaping, where small approximations of a behaviour are rewarded, to build up to a full behaviour. Some of the pups worked on stepping onto a flat board, and we all had a go at shaping to go around a cone. Dave explained how to progress the cone work, and showed us the body language our pups would need to understand for different agility crosses – front cross, ketschker, pivot.

The two hours went very quickly, and all the pups had enough breaks that they were still keen at the end. It was good to have a reminder on some of the things I had forgotten to teach, and a good confidence boost to see that most of the things I have taught held up well in a new place. Dave also reminded us to watch his DVDs – cheeky advertising!
